



CITY OF OWENS CROSS ROADS ORDINANCE NO. 22-005

AN ORDINANCE TO CHANGE RESIDENTIAL SEWER RATES

Whereas, the sanitary sewer rate currently assessed to Residential Customers is either \$40 or \$30 dependent upon the date the account was established, and

Whereas, the current Owens Cross Roads Sewer Plant has reached its maximum capacity, and

Whereas, the cost to expand the existing sewer plant and/or build a new sewer plant will reach beyond the current means available to Owens Cross Roads for said project,

BE IT THEREFORE ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF OWENS CROSS ROADS, ALABAMA, AS FOLLOWS:

Sanitary Sewer Rates for Residential Customers shall be increased according to the following incremental scale over a period of 10 years:

This rate change will take effect on the billing cycle for SEPTEMBER, 2022 Consumption, said billing to be mailed out on or about SEPTEMBER 30, 2022 with payments being due on or before OCTOBER 20, 2022.

ALL NEW SEWER ACCOUNTS OPENED ON OR AFTER FEBRUARY 23, 2022 WILL BE BILLED AT A RATE OF \$44 AND WILL ASSUME THE ANNUAL INCREASE SCALE AS LISTED ABOVE, EFFECTIVE OCT, 2023.
